

Assistant or Associate Research Professor: The Department of Educational, School, and Counseling Psychology is recruiting for a highly qualified individual to help coordinate a new large-scale group randomized intervention trial to evaluate the efficacy of a teacher classroom management training program.



Specific Responsibilities:

The person filling this position will be responsible for overseeing the overall project coordination in Hazelwood School District. The primary responsibility will be to prepare research sites for all aspects of the study (i.e., meet with teachers and building administrators, secure agreement to participate, secure parent/guardian consent for student subjects). The key responsibilities include:

- Safeguarding the fidelity of the IY TT program, providing ongoing coaching to IY TT teachers.
- Coordinating communication among all project partners, and ensuring compliance with all regulations and requirements.
- Support and oversee delivery of all intervention training for teachers participating in the project.
- Contribute to analysis planning.
- Assist with IRB application and compliance.
- Oversee observational data collection and measurement of fidelity.
- Report weekly on progress to the Principal Investigator (Reinke).
- Attend project planning meetings in Columbia.
- Prepare coaching materials and supporting curriculum.
- Prepare research reports, conference presentations, and other dissemination activities related to center research activities.
- Other duties as assigned by Principal Investigator.

Required Qualities: Doctoral Degree in Special Education, School Psychology, Education, Psychology, or related field. Experience with educational and behavioral research methods, including observational coding. Strong organizational and communication skills. Experience in working with diverse educational groups on outreach or research.

Preferred Qualities: Experience in consulting with and supporting elementary teachers on effective classroom management strategies and/or behavior support plans. Experience coordinating or helping conduct large randomized clinical trials.
